At the end of the concert, the three monetary prizes will be awarded by a distinguished panel of judges. An additional "Audience Prize" will be awarded by the audience.

The ALEA III International Composition Prize

The Alea III International Composition Prize was established in 1979 and has also been known under the names of the Politis Composition Prize and the Kucyna International Composition Prize. The purpose of the prize is to promote and encourage the composition of new music by young professional composers of all nationalities under 40 years old.

The <u>2016 competition</u> is devoted to works for 1-10 bassoons and it was announced in conjunction with the <u>Naxos Basson Days</u> seminar and the <u>2016 ALEA III Summer Meetings</u>. There are two Categories: the first for works of 2-10 bassoons and the second for works of bassoon solo or with a small ensemble of up to 3 additional performers.

On November 19, 2016 seven works will be performed and three monetary prizes will be awarded as follows: one work of each category will receive First Prize and \$800.00, while a third work (from either category) will receive Second Prize and \$400.00.

During the 31 International Composition Competitions produced so far more than 6,500 scores have been submitted and 222 have been performed. All scores are kept in the ALEA III library for the perusal of students, performers and any other interested individuals.

During the week of November 14-19, 2016, ALEA III, the Performing Arts Ensemble in Residence at Boston University, Theodore Antoniou – music director, will rehearse and perform the compositions of the seven finalists. ALEA III is well known for its dedication to the presentation of new works and, owing to its flexible instrumentation, is uniquely suited to be the performing group for this competition. Among the judges will be well known personalities of the Boston music scene.
